
Financial Analysis Report



Interpretation:


• Profitability has improved consistently over the three years, with gross margin and EBITDA margin increasing. This indicates better cost management and an improved ability to convert sales into profits.




Figure 1: Trends in Asset Utilization Ratios (2020-2022)




Figure 1: Trends in Investor/Market Ratios (2020-2022)




Figure 1: Capex as a Percentage of Sales and Fixed Assets (2020-2022)
