How does Quill Capital Partners work?

QCP connects individuals seeking mentorship with potential mentors. To participate, you create a mentor profile that showcases the mentoring packages you're willing to offer. Mentees can then find and book your services.

What is the mentor vetting process?

In order to ensure a high-quality mentoring experience for graduates and young professionals, we have established a rigorous vetting process to carefully evaluate the potential of our prospective mentors to share their expertise and experiences. Furthermore, we continuously assess our mentors' performance throughout their service to ensure they are effectively assisting mentees and enhancing their work capabilities.

What are the requirements to become a mentor?

To become a mentor, you should have at least five years of experience in your field, possess strong communication and interpersonal skills, and have a desire to help young professionals succeed in their careers.

Can you earn money through Mentoring?

For many mentors, the financial aspect is secondary. However, you can still earn money by helping others, which can be a rewarding feeling. On average, mentors earn around \$2000 per month, with top mentors making mid 4 figures.

How does Quill Capital Partners make money?

We only get paid if you do! We don't take a cut of your earnings. Instead, we calculate a 20% fee on top of your set price and split the payment with you once you have mentees.

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How much time is required for you as a mentor?

We understand that you're busy, so our program is designed to be efficient. The time you invest is flexible and solely focused on meaningful interaction with mentees. On average, mentors have 2-3 mentees and spend 30 minutes per week with each mentee.

Who are the mentees?

Our mentees come from a diverse range of backgrounds. The majority are industry professionals, graduates seeking growth or a career change.

How much time is required for the mentee?

Mentees have varying expectations that they outline when reaching out to you. We ask that you maintain open communication and show empathy when negotiating what you can commit to.

What does the role involve?

The main responsibilities of a mentor includes providing guidance, support, and advice to a mentee in their professional development. This involve helping the mentee to identify and work towards their career goals, sharing industry insights and knowledge, sharing virtual projects for mentees to work on and offering feedback on their work.

Can mentors provide job referrals or offer job opportunities to their mentees?

Yes, you are welcome to refer them, but our primary focus is on providing a supportive mentoring relationship that helps young professionals grow their skills and advance their careers through their efforts.

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How can I track the progress of my mentee and ensure that they are making meaningful progress in their professional development?

To track the progress of your mentee, you can set specific goals and milestones at the beginning of your mentoring relationship, and regularly check in with your mentee to assess their progress towards those goals. You can also ask your mentee to provide updates on their professional development, such as sharing any new skills they have learned, projects they have completed, or challenges they have faced.

How do you get paid?

You will be paid directly via bank transfer, transferwise or paypal. You will have the option to choose how you get paid.

What are the different pricing options for the mentoring program and services do they include?

We offer three mentoring packages for different levels of support: Basic, Advanced, and Premium.

Basic package starts at £250 and is ideal for mentees seeking interview preparation and general mentoring through chat via the quill platform with one call per month.

Advanced package, which ranges from £350 to £450, is our most popular option and includes interview preparation, general mentoring, and video/telephone calls.

Premium package, For mentees who need more hands-on support, including interview preparation, virtual projects, and tasks, we offer the which ranges from £450 to £650 and includes four calls per month.

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
